
















Plasma is the protein-rich liquid in our blood that can help treat a growing number of illnesses and injuries. Immune globulin, a plasma product, treats various primary and secondary immune disorders, autoimmune diseases, neurological conditions and other diseases with an immune origin.

As researchers discover more treatments, the need for plasma increases—and so does the need for donors. A lifesaving donation takes just over an hour.

Together with your colleagues, you can make all the difference for those who live, work and play in your organization, community and beyond. I've kind of always believed that I was going to be okay, that something would be in place when I needed it. And it turned out that [what I needed] was plasma. When I needed it, it was there, and that's because somebody donated.

Facts about plasma

What is plasma?

Plasma is the protein-rich liquid in blood that helps other blood components circulate throughout the body.

What are plasma derived products used for?

Plasma protein products are currently being used to treat a growing number of illnesses and injuries including:

Why do we need more donated plasma in Canada?

As part of our role, Canadian Blood Services is responsible for monitoring the amount of human plasma available to meet the needs of patients in Canada. For some time, we have been seeing a steady increase in the use of and demand for plasma-derived products in Canada and around the globe.

By increasing the amount of raw material (source plasma) we collect from donors through our existing infrastructure, as well as making plans to collect more in the future, we are striking the right balance for patients.

Why consider donating plasma?

Plasma collected at your plasma donor centre is used for fractionation. This means that your donated plasma will be manufactured into 50 lifesaving medications and distributed to 730 hospitals and clinics across the country. These medications treat a variety of rare, life-threatening, chronic, and genetic conditions.

Who can donate plasma?

Any healthy person who meets our eligibility criteria can donate plasma. You can donate plasma more frequently than whole blood — every 7 days for males and every 14 days for females. More questions? Call us at **1888 2 DONATE** to discuss your eligibility.

Facts about plasma

Plasma donors must:

- Weigh over 50 kg (110 lb.)
- Be in general good health
- Be 17 years of age or older

Can I donate plasma if I have traveled to or lived in a malaria risk area or have history of malaria? You may be able to donate plasma. This is because your donated plasma is manufactured into specialized medications and during this process pathogens in the plasma are eliminated. For more information visit **blood.ca/Plasma**

What is it like to donate plasma?

The process for donating plasma is similar to donating blood. The main difference between a whole blood and plasma donation is the collection method — known as apheresis. Only the plasma portion of your blood is collected; the other blood components (red cells, white cells and platelets) are returned to you.


