Dr. Zeiler is in the final aspect of a clinical PhD at the University of Cambridge, focused in severe neurotrauma, as a Cambridge Trust Scholar in the Division of Anaesthesia under the supervision of world traumatic brain injury (TBI) experts, Prof David K. Menon and Prof Marek Czosnkya.

His past education includes: BSc from the University of Manitoba (with a focus in applied mathematics), MD from the University of Manitoba, Neurosurgery residency at the University of Manitoba and a neurocritical care fellowship at the Montreal Neurological Institute. He currently holds Royal College of Surgeons of Canada certification in Neurosurgery, Fellowship with the Royal College of Surgeons of Canada – FRCSC (Neurosurgery) and will be completing the requirements for Clinician Investigator designation with the Royal College in 2019.

Dr. Zeiler's research interests include neurotrauma and neurocritical care, publishing over 130 peer reviewed manuscripts/abstracts/textbook chapters to date. His current work focuses on the drivers of autoregulatory failure post severe TBI, incorporating genetics and high resolution continuous data from multimodal intra-cranial monitoring. He is a reviewer for various journals pertaining to clinical neuroscience and neurocritical care, including the Canadian Journal of Neurological Sciences, Journal of Neurosurgical Anesthesiology and Neurocritical Care.
